## Hungary Forum picks candidate for presidency

THE Hungarian Democratic Forum (MDF), set to become the leading force in government after Hungary's multi-party elections, has chosen an historian. Mr Laios Fur, aged 59, as

its presidential candidate.

The Forum ended a three-day

national meeting yesterday, at which it had refined the Forum's programme and worked on an election strategy.

Due respect was paid by both the Soviet Union and the Amer-

icans, whose ambassadors sat

in front for the opening ceremonies.

With a membership exceeding 20,000 and victory in four of five recent by elections the

five recent by-elections, the MDF will have the biggest impact on Hungary's political future now that the country is, by law, a multi-party

democracy.

The Forum, not yet a party, is a nationalist movement. The leadership is dominated by poets and writers who consciously lay claim to a populist heritage in a long-standing rift

with the urbanist intellectuals.

The urbanists are often derided as Jews and the Forum admits it is having to battle against its image as an anti-Semitic movement.

In the meeting hall, an imposing statue of Karl Marx was tucked safely out of sight behind a banner which read "MDF — the party of the

future".

Delegates endorsed the Forum's aim of creating a market economy through privatisation, foreign investment, deregulation and subsidy cuts to unprofitable industries.
